Spaceport in Scotland - Can Prestwick become the Space Hub of Europe


Speaker: Stuart McIntyre, Prestwick Spaceport Consortium.

Within four years Prestwick airport could become Europe's space tourism hub after it was named among six possible sites in Scotland for a new spaceport.

Stuart McIntyre, who last year established Prestwick Spaceport Consortium to drive forward the Ayrshire bid tackles all the key points and outlines Prestwick's many advantages, including its long runway which can take the biggest jets and the largest specialist freight planes. The airport was a frequent training location for Concorde crews.

He is also the grandson of David Fowler McIntyre, founder of Scottish Aviation Ltd and Prestwick Airport itself.
