The 9 mile long site was remote, thinly populated and with little infrastructure. In August,10,000 Irish Navvies started arriving, building their own timber houses before starting construction of the biggest factory in the world. Work also started on 2 new Garden Townships to house the 8,000 managers and 12,000, mostly women, workers coming to "stir the Devil's Porridge". Astonishingly, within 12 months, cordite was being produced and in May 1917 the King and Queen came to celebrate production reaching 800 tons a week which was as much as all the other Royal Ordinance Factories combined.

Covid has made it impossible to hold the competition in recent years, and with travel restrictions still in place in some parts of the World, holding the competition in the normal format is still not possible. However, the easing of restrictions in the UK has allowed the competition to be held on a local level.

The Lancashire and Cumbria Network held the local version of PATW under the banner Present Around The Network at UCLAN in Preston during November and was well attended by both contestants and their supporters. The judging was carried out by a panel of Committee Members.

The presentations were all of a high standard, and it was difficult to differentiate between them. Ultimately, the winner was Joshua Bolton with Jianyu Zhao in second place.
