<p><b>How to enter.</b></p>	<p>Please submit a written abstract outlining the scope and aim of your video presentation. Your abstract should be no more than 500 words. The scope of the abstract should cover:</p> <p>Delivering effective healthcare in environments with low resources faces many challenges. Some factors which may be detrimental to the provision of adequate healthcare in low resource settings include lack of sufficient financial resources, facilities and infrastructure; insufficient and/or inadequately educated and trained staff; lack of test equipment, manuals and spare parts; inappropriate equipment donations; large number of healthcare equipment out of service; unreliable power and water supplies; political instability and war.
