<p>How to enter.</p>	<p>Please submit a written abstract outlining the scope and aim of your presentation.</p> <p>Your abstract should be no more than 500 words.</p> <p>The scope of the abstract should cover: Delivering effective healthcare in environments with low resources faces many challenges.</p> <p>Some factors which may be detrimental to the provision of adequate healthcare in low resource settings include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - lack of sufficient financial resources, facilities and infrastructure; - insufficient and/or inadequately educated and trained staff; - lack of test equipment, manuals and spare parts; - inappropriate equipment donations; - large number of healthcare equipment out of service; - unreliable power and water supplies; and/ or - political instability and war. <p>The need is for appropriate, affordable, sustainable, and quality equipment and supplies in both normal and emergency situations.</p> <p>Please include title, all authors and other contributors and a synopsis.</p> <p>Event page link Healthcare Technologies - About - Healthcare - IET EngX</p> <p>Email your abstract to Lynsay Callaghan lcallaghan@theiet.org by 5pm (UTC+1) Thursday 14th August 2026.
